- Q1. There are practical tasks or missions other than language teaching to which knowledge of linguistics is relevant. Choose two areas from the field of applied linguistics and explain how they reflect the relevance of linguistics to other disciplines. (25%)
- Q2. Applied linguists have been concerned about the application of suitable methodologies to research. Suppose you are interested in conducting two studies related to (1) discourse analysis, and (2) language assessment. Which methodology works better for your purposes? The qualitative approach? The quantitative approach? Or a combination of these two? (25%)
- Q3. Look at the transcript of a Chinese EFL learner as she talks about how she learned English in China. Answer the following questions about her use of the word 'grammar(s)' and the feedback she receives from the interviewer in the interaction. Refer to the transcript, providing line numbers where relevant. L stands for the learner and I stands for the interviewer. (25%)

 - c) Identify lines in which there is error correction. Categorize the feedback the learner gets from the interviewer in response to this error. Do you think the learner notices the error correction provided? What evidence suggests?
- Q4. Spacial prepositions convey different conceptualization about the space. That is, how we see the world in different ways. They are meaningful rather than purely grammatical. Look at the following sentences and explain why different prepositions are used with *the road* in the following three sentences. (25%)
 - a) We drove along the road.
 - b) A squirrel ran across the road.
 - c) The construction workers dug through the road.
