Huang Yu-siang's life story is the stuff movies are made of, so it's not surprising that a feature film based on his struggles and triumphs has been made. Entitled *Touch of the Light*, the movie stars Huang as himself and features music written by him. Given the subject matter, the motion picture is a true tale of inspiration, perseverance ___13___ overwhelming odds, and breaking down barriers. *Touch of the Light's* director, Chang Jung-chi, says it is also about pursuing dreams and destroying ___14___.

Huang's talent for music began at a very early age, when ___15___ a visually impaired toddler he was easily able to play notes and melodies on the piano that he heard others play. Excited by her son's musical ability, Huang's mother searched for a piano teacher and ___16___ found one patient enough to teach her child. Due to Huang's disability, his teacher had to play notes over and over ___17___ holding his hands so that he could remember the location of the keys through touch. Understanding the placement of the keys through this type of repetition ___18___ for the next step in the blind musician's development—learning songs by listening to them again and again.

In the belief that it would help their son better ___19___ into society, Huang's parents sent him to a regular elementary school rather than one specifically for the blind. However, in the junior high school, he had trouble, so they ___20___ him to a school for visually impaired students. Later, Huang enrolled in the department of Music at National Taiwan University of Arts and became the first blind person to earn a bachelor's degree in piano performance.

- (A) The asteroid belt is the region of the Solar System located between the orbits of the planets Mars and Jupiter.
- (B) It is a tough truth with which to reconcile that there are about 1,000 such minor “planets” that could threaten our future.
- (C) Although meteoroids usually burn up upon hitting the atmosphere of Earth, not all of them do.
- (D) What’s more disturbing is that it was noticed only 48 hours before passing Earth.
- (E) It was named 2009 DD45, and it came within about 78,000 kilometers.
- (AB) An important independent effort funded by NASA to study asteroids is NEAT, “Near-Earth Asteroid Tracking Team.”

What exactly are asteroids? Some think they are comets; however, they are different in composition. Scientists believe that they are leftover matter from our solar system’s beginnings that didn’t collide to make a larger planet because of the gravity of Jupiter. They number in the thousands, and if joined up, they would form one half the magnitude of the Moon. The largest, named “Ceres,” is about 1,000 kilometers, and the smallest, called “meteoroids,” are the size of gravel. ___21___ Even a meteoroid can cause havoc if you happen to be standing in the wrong place!

“Near-Earth asteroids” are those that stray from their Sun-orbiting paths and come within 195 million kilometers from our planet. ___22___ In 1998, David Rabinowitz, speaking on behalf of NEAT, commented on the potential danger, saying, “...we will have plenty of time to track it...and plan a system for deflecting it...It could be a globally unifying event.”

___23___ A collision with an asteroid measuring only 300 meters would result in a year of cold winter everywhere on Earth, and with one a kilometer in length, it would mean unspeakable destruction.

On March 4, 2009, NASA’s Jet Propulsion Laboratory reported that an asteroid just missed Earth on the previous Monday, March 2. ___24___ That’s only twice as far as some telecommunications satellites and very close when one is aware of the disaster it could have caused.

2009 DD45 was the same size as the asteroid that hit Siberia in 1908, which measured between 21 meters and 47 meters in diameter and caused destruction of 2,000 square kilometers of forest, a section larger than London, England! ___25___ Even though a spokesperson from Australia’s Siding Spring Observatory is reported as telling us that we would have received a bulletin 24 hours in advance if 2009 DD45 had gotten closer, it is still discomfoting, since its impact would have been like a nuclear explosion. Unfortunately, we cannot sigh with relief yet, for 2009 DD45 could return if it is captured by Earth’s gravity.
