COURSE DESCRIPTION: In this A2 level course, students will be improving their conversational skills through listening practice, pair work, group work, role play, and fluency practice. This course will help students develop a foundation in speaking and listening. Students are expected to participate enthusiastically. Students must purchase a copy of the coursebook and bring it to class every week. Each class will cover two or three pages of the book, along with additional speaking and listening practice.

PREREQUISITES/COREQUISITES: None

OBJECTIVES: As a result of this course, you will be able to:

- Develop communicative competence and fluency in spoken English.
- Communicate fluently and accurately with other students in groups and pairs using English.
- Listen for specific information and listen for gist in English.
- Master basic functions of English, such as agreeing and disagreeing, bargaining and discussing prices, asking for and giving recommendations, and asking for and giving suggestions.
- Express yourself with a good range of vocabulary for subjects such as TV vocabulary, places to go in a city, careers, menu items, interesting food, types of movies and types of music.
- Use grammar such as comparative adjectives, should and can, superlative adjectives, simple past with ago, present perfect, determiners, infinitives, as well as using will, may and might.
