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Theme: 112-2 semester campus safety and summer outdoor activity safety promotion

- Notes on outdoor activities:

When engaging in various outdoor activities, you should first pay attention to weather changes and become familiar with the terrain environment. When engaging in activities such as mountain climbing, camping, river tracing, swimming, and waterside activities, in addition to checking the equipment before departure, you should also consider whether your physical condition can bear it. Do not go to dangerous waters or places without lifeguards. Activity. If you encounter bad weather conditions such as strong tides or heavy rains, you should immediately stop all outdoor activities to prevent sudden dangerous incidents (such as beach rip currents, breaking waves, terrain effects, etc.). Strengthen reminders on safety precautions for outdoor activities:

1. When engaging in various outdoor activities, you should first pay attention to weather changes and familiarize yourself with the terrain environment. The Sports Department reminds you of the "Four Don'ts":

- (1) Don't be too pushy: When engaging in activities such as mountaineering, camping, river tracing, water play, waterside research, and field research, in addition to checking equipment before departure, you should also consider whether your physical fitness can bear the load, and don't be too pushy.
- (2) Do not go to dangerous waters: Do not go to dangerous waters or places without lifesaving personnel for activities.
- (3) If the weather is bad, do not engage in outdoor activities: When encountering bad weather conditions such as spring tides or heavy rains, it is not recommended to engage in outdoor activities or all outdoor activities should be stopped immediately to prevent

- sudden dangerous incidents (such as beach rip currents), breaking waves, terrain effects, etc.).
- (4) Do not take shelter from the rain in buildings without lightning protection facilities:

 When lightning and thunder occur, stay away from exposed metal objects, iron railings,
 tall billboards and other buildings, and avoid taking shelter in buildings without
 lightning protection facilities. Rain (such as under work sheds, carports, parasols),
 and should stop swimming, boating and go ashore to a safe shelter from the rain.

2. Summer water safety promotion:

- (1) Summer is the peak season for water play. In order to prevent rip currents and other recreational accidents in the sea, the Marine Disaster Prevention Science Promotion Resources produced by the Marine Education Center of National Taiwan Ocean University (hereinafter referred to as the Marine Education Center) are requested to be circulated to all members of the university. For reference use by teachers and students.
- (2) In view of the fact that "rip currents" and "mad dog waves" are the two main causes of recreational accidents in the sea, the "Ocean Education Center" has produced posters and animations on the themes of "rip currents" and "mad dog waves" in both Chinese and English., and integrate relevant resources into the website: https://tmec.ntou.edu.tw/p/406-1016-38947,r625.php?Lang=zh-tw. This page is also titled "[Information Announcement] Ocean "Disaster Prevention Science Promotion Resources" is the title; it is hoped that this can prevent problems before they happen, so that students can understand how to save themselves when encountering disasters.

2. Traffic safety promotion:

1. Traffic safety promotion in each campus:

Lantan Campus: Linmu Road and Ruisui Road on campus

Intersection (outside motorcycle parking lot 4) There have been many accidents so far since the start of the school year. Most of the causes of the accidents were failure to pay attention to the situation in front of the car and failure to give way to vehicles going straight. In view of this, students are requested to slow down and pay attention to the movements of the vehicles in front (and behind) when passing through this intersection to avoid Another car accident occurred.



2. Case promotion:

(1) At 10:30 a.m. on April 25, 2013, 000, a first-year student of our school, was riding a motorcycle to carry his classmate 000 to class. When passing by the gate of Lantan Campus, he collided with 000, a fellow first-year student, in front of the gate of Lantan Campus. After being rushed to St. Martin's Hospital for treatment, it was found that all three students suffered multiple abrasions on their hands and feet and were not seriously injured.



(2) Meeting up with classmates to watch the fun in Beigang, a female college student died in a car accident

Puzi City, Chiayi County April 28, 113 A car accident occurred on the evening of the same day, killing one person and injuring another. A 19-year-old female college student and her classmates riding were a motorcycle from Tainan to Kanyige, Beigang Town, Yaoyunlin When passing through County. Puzi City, the motorcycle and a



car turned left and crossed the double yellow line. The car collided, and the female college student in the back seat flew into the opposite lane. She was hit by a passing pickup truck and was stuck under the pickup truck. She was rescued and sent to the hospital where she died.
