Student Safety Bulletin No. 010 for the 112th Academic Year

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Theme: Safety precautions for student activities during the summer vacation of 112-2 semester112-2 semester campus safety and summer outdoor activity safety promotion

Dear students, summer vacation is approaching. In order to protect your health and safety, please follow the following reminders to strengthen prevention and precautions, and avoid entering unsafe places or engaging in work without safety planning to avoid accidents (hazardous safety):

— \ Fraud prevention:

- 1.Important!!! Rental fraud prevention publicity case publicity and important reminders:
 - (1) At 11:15 on March 11, 2020, a student from OoHouse OoDepartment OoO went to the Student Affairs Office to inform us that on the FB Jiada Housing Rental Network, we saw a suite with a monthly rent of 5,500 yuan and the private address of the PO writer. After adding LINE, I learned that I am currently ranked 5th and I need to remit the deposit for 2 months before I can view the house first. OThe student asked if I can view the house first by remitting the money first? The other party agreed and refunded the money if not satisfied. After the remittance, March 10 was agreed. At 1130 o'clock in the morning on the same day, I checked the house, but the other party did not show up and the account and PO messages had been

- deleted. I learned that I had been defrauded and reported the case to the oo police station that night.
- (2) It is recommended that students who need housing rentals can use the Ministry of Education's cloud rental website (National Chiayi University-off-campus rental website: https://house.nfu.edu.tw/NCYU) or certified rental websites. It is advisable to search or ask seniors (sisters) for recommendations.
- 2. During the summer vacation, you should be reminded not to click on unknown text message URLs to prevent the phone from being poisoned and used as a springboard to distribute text messages, giving criminals an opportunity to take advantage. And establish the concept of safe use of smartphones. When using online chat apps (such as Line), students are asked to be careful and alert. Do not leak your account number and password, which may be stolen by criminals and then become a victim of fraud.
- 3. Criminals often use the small-amount payment mechanism to commit fraud. They may even activate the victim's small-amount payment service before defrauding the victim to collect the authentication SMS. The more caution you have, the more protection you will have. It is recommended that students apply to the telecommunications company to turn off the small payment function on their mobile phones, and do not receive text messages on behalf of them.
- 4. In the face of endless fraud and criminal methods with increasingly innovative techniques, in order to avoid becoming a victim of gangsters who fake kidnappings over the phone or fake accidents (traffic accidents, illness hospitalizations) to defraud real money. Students are reminded that if they receive a suspicious fraud call or accidentally encounter a criminal intending to defraud, they should remember the three anti-fraud steps: "keep calm", "check carefully", and "call the police immediately or call the 165 anti-fraud consultation hotline" for assistance.
- 5. Please check the announcement information on the "165 Anti-Fraud" website of the National Police Agency of the

Ministry of the Interior (website https://165.npa.gov.tw/#/), or join the 165 anti-fraud



website of the National Police Agency of the Ministry of the Interior Scam LINE official website to download the latest fraud techniques to avoid being deceived.

二、Traffic safety:

1. According to statistics from the School Safety Center of the Ministry of Education, off-campus traffic accidents are the main cause of accidental casualties among students. During the summer vacation, students may have an increased chance of using transportation due to factors such as participating in activities or working part-time jobs.

Therefore, students are particularly reminded to pay attention to their own safety when riding motorcycles, micro-electric two-wheelers, bicycles, etc., and to abide by traffic rules while driving. , Slow down and avoid driving under the influence of alcohol, fatigue or dangerous driving for safety reasons.

2. Traffic safety promotion in each campus:

Lantan Campus: There have been many accidents since the start of school at the intersection of Linmu Road and Ruisui Road on campus (outside the No. 4 motorcycle parking lot). Most of the accidents were caused by failure to pay attention to the situation in front of the car and failure to give way to vehicles going straight; in view of this, please When passing through this intersection, students must slow down and pay attention to the movements of the cars in front (and behind) to avoid another car accident.

3. Case promotion:

(1) At 10:30 a.m. on April 25, 2013, OOO, a first-year student of our school, was riding a motorcycle to carry his classmate OOO to class. When passing by the gate of Lantan Campus, he collided with OOO, a fellow first-year student, in front of the gate of Lantan Campus. After being rushed to St. Martin's Hospital for treatment, it was found that all three students suffered multiple abrasions on their hands and feet and were not seriously injured.





(2) At 11:15 a.m. on May 10, 2013, OOO, a second-year student of our school, was riding a motorcycle to school when he was passing by the gate of Lantan Campus and was chased from behind by a passenger driving a passenger car. According to the student's own evaluation He only had multiple bruises on his hands and feet and was not serious. The staff on duty still reminded him that he should go to the hospital for examination.

三、Notes on outdoor activities:

When engaging in various outdoor activities, you should first pay attention to weather changes and become familiar with the terrain environment. When engaging in activities such as mountain climbing, camping, river tracing, swimming, and waterside activities, in addition to checking the equipment before departure, you should also consider whether your physical condition can bear it. Do not go to dangerous waters or places without lifeguards. Activity. If you encounter bad weather conditions such as strong tides or heavy rains, you should immediately stop all outdoor activities to prevent sudden dangerous incidents (such as beach rip currents, breaking waves, terrain effects, etc.). Strengthen reminders on safety precautions for outdoor activities:

- 1. When engaging in various outdoor activities, you should first pay attention to weather changes and familiarize yourself with the terrain environment. The Sports Department reminds you of the "Four Don'ts":
- (1) Don't be too pushy: When engaging in activities such as mountaineering, camping, river tracing, water play, waterside research, and field research, in addition to checking equipment before departure, you should also consider whether your physical fitness can bear the load, and don't be too pushy.
- (2) Do not go to dangerous waters: Do not go to dangerous waters or places without life-saving personnel for activities.
- (3) If the weather is bad, do not engage in outdoor activities: When encountering bad weather conditions such as spring tides or heavy rains, it is not recommended to engage in

- outdoor activities or all outdoor activities should be stopped immediately to prevent sudden dangerous incidents (such as beach rip currents), breaking waves, terrain effects, etc.).
- (4) Do not take shelter from the rain in buildings without lightning protection facilities: When lightning and thunder occur, stay away from exposed metal objects, iron railings, tall billboards and other buildings, and avoid taking shelter in buildings without lightning protection facilities. Rain (such as under work sheds, carports, parasols), and should stop swimming, boating and go ashore to a safe shelter from the rain.

2. Summer water safety promotion:

- (1) Summer is the peak season for water play. In order to prevent rip currents and other recreational accidents in the sea, the Marine Disaster Prevention Science Promotion Resources produced by the Marine Education Center of National Taiwan Ocean University (hereinafter referred to as the Marine Education Center) are requested to be circulated to all members of the university. For reference use by teachers and students.
- (2) In view of the fact that "rip currents" and "mad dog waves" are the two main causes of recreational accidents in the sea, the "Ocean Education Center" has produced posters with animations and the themes of "rip currents" "mad dog waves" both Chinese and English. and integrate relevant resources



into the website: https://tmec.ntou.edu.tw/p/406-1016-38947,r625.php?Lang=zh-tw. This page is also titled "[Information Announcement] Ocean "Disaster Prevention Science Promotion Resources." is the title; it is hoped that this can prevent problems before they happen, so that
